Thursday 2 June

A flotilla of up to 70 craft will sail up and down the Humber, setting off from Hull Marina at 6.15pm arriving at Hessle Haven at 8.15pm where it will turn around and head back into Hull.

In the evening the Parish Council will be lighting the beacon along with more than 1500 others across the UK and Commonwealth. To make more of this event the Village Hall will be open from 7.30pm for the 'Pre- Beacon Bash' where drinks and nibbles will be available and a tribute to the Queen's 70 years on the throne will be shown on the big screen. The Church bells will be rung from 19:52 to 20:22 to highlight the 70 years, and the Swanland

Piper will play from Spy Hill before the lighting of the beacon at 9.45pm. This will be followed by a musical entertainment from Ferriby Ladies Choir.

No Dogs will be allowed at this event.

Friday 3 June

The Ferriby Social Club will open at 12 noon for an afternoon of music. Jade Scott starts the afternoon's entertainment at 2.45pm followed by solo artist Danny Shenton, then a break followed by Otto at approximately 7.30 and into the evening inside the club with the 80's band Glory Days. The bar will be open for all, hot snacks, cakes, soft play, raffle and a stall hosting the North Ferriby Branch of the Royal British Legion, plus learn about the history of your village Social club.

At 7.30pm, the hugely successful film 'The King's Speech' starring Colin Firth, who won 'Best Actor' Oscar for his performance as King George VI, will be screened in the Village Hall. For tickets, please see the Village Hall website.

Saturday 4 June

On Saturday you will want to head to the Riverside Walkway.

The Parish Council will be hosting the Conservation Open Day from 11-2pm on the Riverside Walkway, with activities for all, young or old, arranged by Mires Beck and Michele Davy, an environmental artist. They will be demonstrating the wealth of wildlife to be seen here and setting up a guided walk around the area. It is an ideal opportunity to find out more about the nature on your own doorstep and the plans the Parish Council have to improve the biodiversity of the area, working in partnership with Mires Beck Nursery. The event is free to all thanks to National Lottery funding.

On both Saturday and Sunday, between 10 and 4pm, the Riding for the Disabled site at the Riverside Walkway will be contributing to the fun with a bouncy castle, face-painting, a dog show and an obstacle course. Food and drink will be available from their kiosk all day.

In the evening the Village Hall will be hosting 'Dance Through the Decades' with musicians Bossa Revista playing classic tunes from the 1950's to present day. A light supper will be provided and tickets are on sale from the Village Hall website.
